SHASON OUTHOOK THE HUESMAN ERA BEGINS

The University of Tennessee at Chattanooga plays its 102nd year of college football in 2009 and, led by first-year head coach Russ Huesman, is on a mission to "Restore the Glory" to the proud Huesman has first-hand program. knowledge of the glory years of Chattanooga football after a standout career with the Mocs from 1978-81. During his time at UTC, Huesman helped guide the Mocs to two Southern Conference Championships in 1978 and 1979.

When the Mocs began looking for a new football coach following last season, they were in search of a proven winner who could unite the fan base and had a passion for UTC. Huesman possesses all of those qualities and the Mocs are already benefitting from his leadership and enthusiasm before the first snap has taken place.

Huesman comes to UTC with 25 years of college coaching experience, spending the last five as the defensive coordinator at the University of Richmond. His coaching prowess was on hand for all of Chattanooga to see in the NCAA Football Championship Subdivision national title game at Finley Stadium on Dec. 19, 2008. The Spiders' defense held the Montana Grizzlies to just 39 yards rushing and seven points in a 24-7 win for Richmond.

Three days later, a capacity crowd jammed into the Stadium Club at Finley Stadium to watch Huesman's introduction as the team's 22nd head coach. Since that time, there has been a buzz around Chattanooga about the Mocs football program that has not been felt since the last time UTC won a conference title in 1984.

Huesman hit the ground running immediately after being hired. Within days he had put together an impressive staff of assistant coaches and pulled together a strong 15-member recruiting class. Despite only having a few weeks to

Bones Restaurant drew another capacity crowd, providing further evidence that the interest in Chattanooga Football was growing.

More proof that the fan base has been ignited by Huesman and his staff was seen throughout spring practice. Over 100 fans showed up for both of the team's informal scrimmages during the month-long drills. A near-record crowd of over 1,100 were in attendance for the Spring Game and accompanying festivities at Finley Stadium.

Season tickets are selling at a record pace and are way up from this time last year. UTC's athletic website, Go-Mocs.com, has seen record traffic since Huesman was hired and fans throughout the city and region are anticipating the home opener against Glenville State on Thursday, Sept. 3 at 7:00 p.m.



OUARTERBACK

As is always the case, the offense begins with the quarterback position where the Mocs are talented and deep with experience.

Seniors Jare Gault and Tony Pastore both saw significant time under center last season. Gault threw for 961 yards and seven touchdowns while Pastore's 320 yards against Cumberland were the most by a Moc since 2004 and the 19th-highest mark in school history. Pastore was hampered by nagging injuries through the spring workouts, allowing Gault to distance himself as the starter following spring practice.

The addition of Tennessee transfer and Chattanooga native B.J. Coleman makes the QB race wide open. Coleman, who will be a sophomore and have three years of eligibility remaining, brings with him Division I experience at a high level and a significant prep resume that includes Tennessee Mr. Football honors and a four-star rating from various recruiting services.

Junior Cody Romans and incoming freshman Graham Nichols will also be competing at the quarterback position.

Competition for the starting job at quarterback will be fierce. With teammates pushing each other to get better, whoever wins the position in the end, will be ready to perform on gameday.

"Jare had a really good spring and B.J. Coleman brings a lot to the table," explained Huesman. "When we start evaluating quarterbacks, there is going to be a lot of competition which should make everyone better."



RUNNING BACK

The Mocs also have a strong contingent of ball carriers at their disposal for the 2009 season. Senior Bryan Fitzgerald looks to return to form after missing the 2008 campaign. He was a preseason All-SoCon selection before a season-ending knee injury put him on the sidelines prior to the start of practice. He led the team with 798 yards on the ground in 2007. UTC's leading rusher in 2008, senior Errol Wynn, is expected to redshirt the upcoming season. He rushed for 636 yards, despite playing most of last season with a variety of injuries.

Both Wynn and Fitzgerald sat out spring practice, allowing freshmen J.J. Jackson and Bo Dyer to get the majority of the work in the offseason. Both will continue to compete for backup duties in the fall. Incoming freshman Chris Awuah is also slated to compete at the running back position.

Senior Shaun Kermah returns at fullback for the Mocs. He was second on the team in 2008 with 253 yards while his 3.9 yards per carry led UTC. Junior Courtland Ellzey and sophomore Ryan Geist backed up Kermah in spring practice and will compete for the same duties in the fall. Also joining the mix at fullback will be incoming freshmen Gunner Miller and Will Brooks.

"We didn't get to see Fitz in the spring but he is getting better every day and will be 100% when training camp rolls around," said Huesman. "From what he has done in the past, I think he could be an exciting back for us and an all-conference type of player. We also like a lot of the things Kermah did in the spring. He is very versatile with the ball and if he continues to improve his blocking can be solid at that position."



OFFENSIVE LINE

After a strong offseason of hard work in the weight room and on the practice field, the offensive line is expected to be one of the Mocs' most improved areas.

With four starters returning, the offensive line has the deepest group of letterwinners entering the 2009 season. Senior Bryce Garcia and juniors Justin Galyon, Chris Harr and T.J. Hurless are all back after lining up in 2008. Galyon, Harr and Hurless started all 12 games for the Mocs in 2008.


Freshmen Will Hewitt and Dustin Tate have moved into starting spots on the depth chart following spring practice.

Backing up the first group will be junior Devaunte Dotstry, sophomore Jeff Maxi and freshmen Adam Miller and Austin Wilson. Also competing for playing time in their second year in the program are sophomore Nick Gipson and freshman Tucker Cathey. Gipson missed all of spring practice with a knee injury he suffered in winter conditioning and could end up redshirting in the fall.

Incoming freshmen David Clemmons and Jake Francis will join the offensive line group when training camp starts in August.

"I like this group we have up front," continued Huesman. "We are young, athletic and have great workers. Chris Harr can be an all-conference type of player. He can run, move and is a great leader, but I am expecting good things from the entire group."





RECEIVER

The Mocs receiving corps is another experienced and deep collection of talent. With five returners and some talented newcomers battling for time on the field, the Mocs' receiving game is sure to benefit from the competition.

Led by seniors Justin Buckhalter, Blue Cooper and Clint Woods and junior Chris Pitchford, UTC will have a full arsenal of weapons at its disposal.

Woods was chosen by his teammates to be one of three team captains. He has a total of 1,001 vards on 95 receptions in his career and could break into the top-10 in both categories in the UTC record book.

Cooper recorded 366 yards and three touchdowns last season, despite missing two games with an injury. He also missed all of spring practice, but is expected to be healthy when training camp begins in the fall.

Pitchford started nine times last year and had 23 catches for 245 yards. Buckhalter played in all 12 games in 2008, starting four with 10 catches for 105 yards.

Sophomore Sloan Allison will get in the mix after moving over from quarterback in the spring. Freshman Brian Sutherland will also be competing at the receiver position.

Incoming freshman Marlon Anthony is a talented prep payer who could also get on the field in his first year at UTC.

Senior Chris Marshall played in seven games last year, but is planning to redshirt the 2009 season.

"If we keep developing this strong group of guys, we will have a solid receiving corps," explained Huesman. "There is talent in the group that played last year and their experience should help us. We also have some new faces who will be fighting to get some playing time once training camp begins.'



TIGHT END

The tight end position will be handled by senior Patrick Wilkinson, junior Garrett Hughes and freshman Louis Gibson. Wilkinson caught six passes in 11 games last season, including one touchdown against Georgia Southern. Gibson moved over from defensive end and was impressive in spring practice. Hughes missed all of the spring workouts with a wrist injury, but is expected to be ready for training camp in August.

"These three guys will be battling for the starting position," stated Huesman. "They all bring something different to the table and I think all three can be quality tight ends.'



DEFENSIVE LINE

The Mocs will have a strong defensive line with six lettermen, including two returning starters in 2009. This group will set the tone for what looks to be a much improved UTC defense.

Senior B.J. Taylor started all 12 games at left tackle and led the team with 10 tackles-for-loss in 2008. He is back at the same position for the upcoming season.

Junior Jaron Norfleet is the other returning starter, holding down the left end. Sophomore Nick Craig is set to take over at right tackle while senior Josh Beard will hold down the right end.

Backing up this group includes sophomores Omre Harris, La'Nard Carr and Pete Evans and freshmen Michael Carter and De'Markus Lee.

Incoming freshmen Joshua Williams and Durlandis Hill will also be pushing for time on the field.

"I think we have a chance to be pretty good on the defensive line," said head coach Russ Huesman. "B.J. Taylor is going to be a really good player and a tremendous leader. Josh Beard also had a really good spring and is talented up front. Jaron Norfleet and Nick Craig both have the ability to make plays."



LINEBACKER


The Mocs have four quality linebackers to fill the three spots on the field in 2009. Senior Joseph Thornton has all-conference potential after leading the Mocs with 79 tackles last season.

Senior Tony Swafford has moved up from safety. He was second on the team with 61 tackles in 2008 and will compete with fellow senior and team captain Steven Smigelsky and senior Doug Faatiliga for the majority of the time at the two remaining linebacker spots.

Behind this first group includes sophomores Thomas Green and Ryan McGowan and freshmen Arsenio Clemmons, Ryan Consiglio, Shane Heatherly and Phillip Walliser. Clemmons was the Defensive MVP of the Spring Game after returning a fumble recovery for a touchdown.

Also joining the team are incoming freshmen Wes Dothard and Gunner Miller.

"I think Joe Thornton can be an all-conference linebacker for us," continued Huesman. "We have a solid group with Doug Faatiliga, Steven Smigelsky and Tony Swafford. Hopefully we can mix up the positions and get the three best players on the field at the same time."



SECONDARY

Probably the most talented group on the field for the Mocs in 2009 will be the defensive secondary. Boasting five returning lettermen, the Mocs will have speed and experience to lead the defensive unit.

Junior Buster Skrine and sophomore Chris Lewis-Harris will hold down the cornerback positions while sophomores J.D. Dothard and Jordan Tippit will be the starting safeties.

Lewis-Harris led the team with three interceptions last season while Skrine had 48 tackles on the year. Dothard started all 12 games in 2008 with Tippit adding 37 tackles in 10 games as a reserve for the Mocs.

Backing up the corners is sophomore Joel Bradford. Incoming freshman Briant Henry, D.J. Key and Kadeem Wise will also be fighting for playing time in their first year in the program.

"I really like the secondary," added Huesman. "They are young, athletic, can run and are fearless back there. If they continue to work hard we have the potential to be really good in the secondary."



Sophomore Sloan Allison is set to handle the holding duties on field goals and PATs.




PUNTER
