# ROGER BROWN



## CHANCELLOR



Dr. Roger G. Brown, a proven academic leader and native Tennessean, is the fifteenth head of The University of Tennessee at Chattanooga. His appointment as Chancellor was celebrated by the campus in February of 2006.

Under Brown's leadership, the campus has experienced record enrollment growth at all levels, reaching the significant milestone of surpassing more than 10,000 students in fall 2009. Since taking the helm of the Chattanooga campus, he has promoted UTC's mission as a metropolitan university with special emphasis in the fields of science, mathematics, and technology. Brown has also pledged the campus' commitment to teacher preparation, healthcare professions, business and commerce, and cultural appreciation.

UTC recently completed a strategic planning initiative that focuses campus efforts on the power of partnerships, especially relationships within the learning laboratory of Chattanooga. In 2008, Chattanooga earned the Community Engagement designation by the Carnegie Foundation for the Advancement of Teaching in recognition of its many successful partnerships in the community.

Brown came to Chattanooga from the Uni-

versity of North Carolina at Pembroke, where he served as Provost and Vice Chancellor for Academic Affairs since 2000. Previously, he had served since 1991 in various academic and administrative capacities with the University of North Carolina at Charlotte. Brown left UNC Charlotte in 2000 as Senior Associate Provost and Associate Vice Chancellor for Academic Affairs.

A political scientist with particular academic emphasis in American government, Brown earned bachelor's and master's degrees in Political Science from the University of Tennessee and the Ph.D. in Political Science from The Johns Hopkins University. He began his teaching career at Iowa State University in 1983 before joining the UNC Charlotte faculty in 1985.

In 2002, Brown was appointed to the inaugural delegation of the American Association of State Colleges and Universities Sino-American Leadership Development Training for Higher Education Leaders in China. He has traveled on assignment for the U.S. Department of State to Syria, Jordan, and Israel. He also helped establish international exchanges with universities in Germany, France, South Korea, and South Africa.

In Chattanooga, Brown is a member of Rotary International and has also been named to the United Way of Greater Chattanooga Board of Directors, the RiverCity Company Board, and the Chattanooga Area Chamber of Commerce Board of Directors. He is a commissioner of the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools and has been appointed to the Southeast Tennessee PreK-16 Education Council.

Brown recently agreed to serve as the Chair of the Southern Conference Council of Presidents. This appointment runs through the 2011-12 academic year.

Brown's wife and partner, Dr. Carolyn Thompson, is also a committed community activist. In addition to her involvement and support of the university, she currently serves on the boards of the Community Foundation of Greater Chattanooga, Memorial Healthcare System, Jordan Thomas Foundation, Community Impact, and Women's Fund of Greater Chattanooga.

The couple has two children, Caroline and Austin. Roger and Carolyn also share custody of "Madeline Albright," a rescued husky mix with diplomatic immunity.

# RICK HART

## DIRECTOR OF ATHLETICS



When Rick Hart came to the University of Tennessee at Chattanooga, he brought with him a vision and plan for the future of the Mocs. Since his hiring on May 23, 2006, Hart has changed the landscape of the UTC Athletics Department with his leadership, organizational skills and innovative ideas on how to fulfill the Mocs' mission of preparing students for productive and meaningful lives. Entering his fifth season as the Director of Athletics, Hart's efforts have made a tremendous impact on the Mocs student-athletes' quest for comprehensive excellence – academically, athletically and socially.

### Academically

- Added staff to both the Compliance and Academic Services departments to help student-athletes progress toward the ultimate goal of earning a college degree.
- Over half of the Mocs' student-athletes made the Athletic Director's Honor Roll each of the last two semesters.
- Shown continuous improvement in the overall grade-point-averages for student-athletes in each of the last five semesters - highlighted by a 2.87 g.p.a. in the spring of 2010, the highest semester mark for the Mocs since Hart's arrival.
- Developed and implemented an ambitious APR improvement plan that is working to increase the APR scores of all Mocs athletics programs.

### Athletically

- Captured 14 regular season and 16 tournament championships in the Southern Conference over the last four seasons, more than any other SoCon school during that time.
- In 2008-09, Chattanooga posted school records with five teams competing in the NCAA Championships and 10 squads represented in the postseason.
- Set a school record in 2009 with a 99th place finish in the NACDA Learfield Director's Cup that measures the overall success of all Division I athletic programs. Three of the Mocs' top-5 all time finishes in the NACDA Director's Cup have come in Hart's tenure.
- Captured UTC's first Germann Cup in 2007-08, signifying the best all-around women's sports program in the

Southern Conference; and finished second in both the Germann Cup and Commissioner's Cup standings in 2008-09.

- 15 student-athletes selected as SoCon Athletes of the Year while three Mocs have been named the SoCon Female Athletes of the Year.

### Socially

- Encouraged Chattanooga student-athletes in their involvement with many local community projects and charity work and has personally served as a member of the Chattanooga Rotary, the Grand Marshal of the 2007 Region 4 Special Olympics and is a sought-after speaker among the area's many civic organizations.
- Cultivated and maintained relationships with local and national press that has led to unequalled media attention for a program of this size.
- During the men's basketball NCAA Tournament run in 2009, the NBC's "Late Show with Jimmy Fallon" adopted the Mocs as its team of the tournament. The week-long exposure brought in an estimated \$500,000 of advertising and national exposure for UTC.
- Expanded educational programming for student-athletes, coaches and staff as part of a commitment to learning and personal and professional development.
- Focused attention on strengthening the relationship between Mocs Athletics and the UTC campus community.

Hart has also been very successful in the traditional roles as UTC Athletics Director. In an effort to ensure efficient and effective management of all elements of the athletics program, and to better align athletics with the academic mission of the institution, Hart developed and installed the Strategic Plan for UTC Athletics. A focus on the student-athlete experience has resulted in increased ticket sales and fundraising, innovative partnerships, improved athletics facilities and the addition of quality coaches.

### Revenue Generation/Fundraising/Attendance

- Signed an exclusive, long-term marketing rights deal with Learfield Sports that guarantees record revenues from advertising and marketing with UTC Athletics.
- Restructured the Mocs Club, resulting in nearly a 20% increase in the number of members over the last year.
- Secured three major gifts from UTC benefactors that totaled over \$2 million in the past two years.
- Excluding these three major gifts, the Mocs Club capped the \$1 million mark for each of the last two years.
- Implemented a donor program for football season ticket sales, hospitality and parking.
- Overall ticket revenues have increased nearly 35% since Hart's first year.
- Women's basketball has led the SoCon in attendance in each of Hart's four years.
- Football set a school record with over 2,500 season tickets sold in 2009. UTC averaged over 10,000 fans per game for a full season for the first time in Finley Stadium history in 2009.

### Facilities

- Completed the state-of-the-art Brenda Lawson Student-

Athlete Success Center which includes the Wolford Family Strength and Conditioning and Chattem Basketball Practice Facilities.

- Received funding from Renee Haugerud and John Murphy in support of major improvements to Scrappy Moore Field, the Mocs' football practice facility.
- Partnered with the City of Chattanooga and The First Tee to construct a practice facility for the golf teams.
- Enhanced the Football Locker Room, Visiting Team Basketball Locker Rooms, Academic Computer Lab and Administrative Offices
- Installed video boards in McKenzie Arena
- Acquired land needed to develop plans and a funding model for an on-campus facility for Track & Field and Women's Soccer.

### Coaches

- Ignited fans everywhere with the hiring of Russ Huesman, a former Moc letter winner, in December 2008 to "Restore the Glory" to Chattanooga Football.
- Orchestrated Jeff Clark's return to the head coaching position of the women's tennis program in 2007.
- Hired former Moc Heath Eslinger to head the wrestling program in 2009. Eslinger won the Mocs' sixth-straight SoCon regular season title in 2010.

Managing finite resources in collegiate athletics is widely known as a difficult task. Hart made fiscal stewardship a priority for the department since his arrival. With diligent leadership and a commitment from each and every member of the department, UTC Athletics has made significant strides towards reducing the financial burden on the institution – including a balanced budget three of the last four years.

Hart arrived on the UTC campus after serving seven years at the University of Oklahoma in various athletics administrative capacities. Hart's career with the Sooners began in 1999 as the Director of Marketing and Licensing. He became Assistant Athletics Director for Marketing and Licensing in 2001, and developed and implemented marketing campaigns which generated annual ticket revenues in excess of \$19.5 million. Hart was promoted to Associate Athletics Director for Program Advancement and Branding in 2003 and Senior Associate Athletics Director in 2006.

Hart has also worked in athletics for the University of North Carolina and East Carolina University and has served with the U.S. Olympic Committee. A 1994 graduate of UNC, Hart earned a bachelor's degree in Physical Education, Health and Sport Science. Hart and his wife, Allison, also a graduate of North Carolina, have a son, Trevor, 11, and a daughter, Caroline, 8.

A third-generation athletics administrator, Hart's father, Dave, currently serves as Executive Director of Athletics at the University of Alabama, and his late grandfather, Dave Sr., served in a variety of roles within collegiate athletics including a stint as the Commissioner of the Southern Conference from 1987-91.



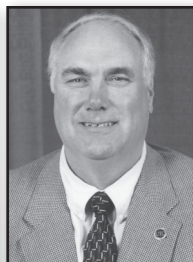

### ACADEMICALLY

- 31 student-athletes had a 4.0 grade-point-average in the Spring of 2010.
- Over half of the Mocs' student-athletes made the Dean's List for the last two semesters.
- 10 teams had a 3.0+ grade-point-average in the spring 2010, including men's and women's cross country, men's and women's golf, soccer, men's and women's tennis, men's and women's track & field and volleyball.

### ATHLETICALLY

- Four teams won SoCon titles in 2009-10, including women's basketball, wrestling, softball and women's golf.
- Six Mocs won individual SoCon titles or athlete of the year awards in 2009-10, including Emmanuel Kirwa (Cross Country), Shanara Hollinquest (Women's Basketball), Stephan Jaeger (Men's Golf), Josh Beard (Football), Anneli Uys (Outdoor Track) and Dean Pavlou (Wrestling).
- Women's basketball senior Shanara Hollinquest was named the SoCon Female Athlete of the Year.
- Frank Reed (Softball), Russ Huesman (Football) and Colette Murray (Women's Golf) were all named SoCon Coach of the Year in 2009-10.

### SOCIALLY

- The Mocs volunteered at numerous community events throughout the year, including Bloodanooga, Special Olympics, Race for the Cure, Chattanooga Area Food Bank, Breast Cancer Awareness Day and many more.
- The Student-Athlete Advisory Committee (SAAC) has been established to encourage and develop student leadership.

## 2009-10 SPORT-BY-SPORT RECAP

The 2009-10 athletics season at Chattanooga was another banner year for the Mocs. UTC won three Southern Conference titles in the regular season and two more tournament trophies. The Mocs were represented by six teams in the postseason while six individuals won SoCon titles or athlete of the year honors. Chattanooga had three SoCon Coach of the Year recipients and a pair of All-Americans.

**Men's Basketball (John Shulman, head coach)****15-18, 6-12 SoCon North/tie 3rd**

- Without returning a starter from the 2009 Southern Conference Championship squad, the Mocs earned 15 wins against a schedule that featured 10 postseason teams including six that played in the NCAA Tournament. UTC claimed its 13th Dr Pepper Classic title.
- Ty Patterson completed his UTC career as a second team All-SoCon performer. Jeff Smith, who still has a year of eligibility remaining, completed his business degree graduating in December of 2009.
- Chattanooga played its 1,000th DI game in its final 2009-10 appearance in the SoCon Tournament. The Mocs are 625-375 in those 33 seasons, a 62.5 winning percentage.
- The Mocs won nine games when tied or trailing in the second half.
- John Shulman won his 100th game on Jan. 11 with a 58-45 SoCon North win over UNCG. The Mocs held the Spartans to their lowest point total in a league game (Big South & SoCon) in their Division I era with 45 points.

**Women's Basketball (Wes Moore, head coach)****24-9, 16-4 SoCon/1st • NCAA First Round**

- UTC claimed its 11th consecutive Southern Conference Regular Season title.
- Lady Mocs won the 2010 Southern Conference Tournament and advanced to the NCAA Tournament for the eighth time in 10 years.
- Senior Shanara Hollinquest was named the 2009-10 Southern Conference Player of the Year for the second consecutive year and was tabbed the league's Female Athlete of the Year.
- Hollinquest closed out her career ranked sixth in scoring (1700 pts) and fifth in rebounding (891 rbs). She set a school record for free throws made without a miss (14-of-14) against Samford in the SoCon Championship game. She also posted a school record for career made free throws with 498.
- Chattanooga led the league in attendance, averaging more than 2,036 per home game.

**Cross Country (Bill Gautier, head coach)****Men (4th SoCon/6th NCAA Regionals) • Women (3rd SoCon/16th NCAA Regionals)**

- Junior Emmanuel Kirwa repeated as the Southern Conference Runner of the Year by winning the men's SoCon Championship. He was also named All-Region for his performance at the NCAA Region Championships where he placed 18th.
- The men's cross country team posted a 3.52 g.p.a., ranking No. 9 in the nation.
- Both the men's and women's teams earned USTFCCA All-Academic Team honors.
- The women's team posted a 3.61 g.p.a. in the fall semester, the highest team mark for a semester on record at UTC.
- Three all-conference performers, including Kirwa, Anneli Uys and Heather Stuiwe.
- Three rookies were named to the inaugural SoCon All-Freshman Team, including Stuiwe, Kyle McLarty and Mark Cole.

**Football (Russ Huesman, head coach) • 6-5, 4-4 SoCon/T4th**

- Chattanooga finished 6-5 on the year, securing the first winning season since 2005. UTC finished 4-4 in the SoCon for the first time since 1998. The Mocs' six wins equal the total of wins over the last three seasons - 1-11 in 2008; 2-9 in 2007; 3-8 in 2006.
- Senior DE Josh Beard led the nation and tied a single-season school record with 12.0 sacks on the year. He was the SoCon Defensive Player of the Year and 3rd Team AP All-American.

- The Mocs set or tied a number of school records this year, including tying for most All-SoCon honorees (8), most academic All-SoCon honorees (10), tying for most SoCon Player of the Week Honors (8), most season tickets sold (2,527), senior Josh Beard set a school record with 12 sacks and DE Josh Williams set a school freshman record with seven sacks.
- Senior kicker Craig Camay was named to the second team while senior defensive lineman Josh Beard made the third team. Camay and Beard were the 24th and 25th Mocs to earn All-American honors.
- Mocs fans spun the turnstiles at Finley Stadium at a near-record pace in 2009. UTC had the third largest crowd at Finley Stadium against Greenville State (14,002) and the fifth highest attendance against Furman (11,201). UTC finished the year No. 34 in total attendance (52,515) and No. 31 in average attendance (10,503) in the FCS. Chattanooga averaged 10,000+ for a full season for the first time since moving to Finley Stadium in 1997.

**Men's Golf (Mark Guhne, head coach) – 7th SoCon • 12th NCAA Regionals**

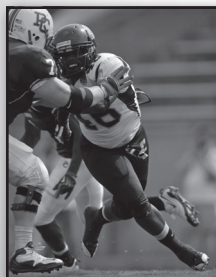
- UTC competed in its fourth straight NCAA postseason event in San Diego. The Mocs finished 12th in the NCAA Southwest Regional.
- For the second straight season, Chattanooga was ranked No. 1 in the country in the Fall. UTC ended up No. 42 on Golfstat and No. 44 in the Golfweek/Sagarin Performance Index.
- Two Chattanooga golfers were named to the All-SoCon squad in Derek Rende and Stephan Jaeger with Jaeger earning SoCon Player of the Year accolades. The duo were also named to the PING All-Region team, while Rende was named a Cleveland Golf/Srixon All-American Scholar. Steven Fox was named to the SoCon's All-Freshman team.
- Jaeger ended the season ranked nationally at No. 75 on Golfstat and No. 74 in the Golfweek/Sagarin Performance Index.
- The Mocs won the Cleveland Golf Palmetto Intercollegiate topping an 18-team field that included two top 20 programs – Clemson and Virginia. Fox tied for medalist honors at the Furman Intercollegiate with 2009 U.S. Amateur finalist Ben Martin (Clemson).

**Women's Golf (Colette Murray, head coach) – 1st SoCon • 18th NCAA Regionals**

- The Mocs won their first Southern Conference Championship in just the third year of the program. Down five strokes with nine holes to play, UTC played the back nine at two-under par to win by eight shots over College of Charleston and UNC Greensboro by 16.
- Chattanooga ended the year ranked No. 39 on Golfstat and No. 44 in the Golfweek/Sagarin Performance Index.
- Emma de Groot and Maria Juliana Loza earned All-SoCon honors.
- The Mocs made their third NCAA postseason appearance in as many seasons at the NCAA East Regional in Greenville, N.C. Chattanooga finished 18th shooting 910 over 54 holes.
- de Groot had a strong season ending up ranked No. 38 nationally on Golfstat and No. 51 in the Golfweek/Sagarin Performance Index.

**Softball (Frank Reed, head coach) • 39-17, 19-5 SoCon/1st**

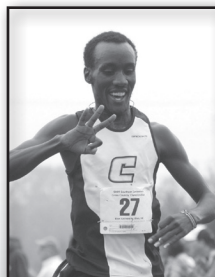
- The Lady Mocs captured the program's fourth-straight and 12th overall Southern Conference regular season title after winning a conference record 19 contests.
- Chattanooga had five student-athletes named to the all-conference squads. Senior second baseman Tia Blosser and juniors outfielder Lyndsey Stiles and third baseman Tiffany Baker were selected to the first team, while junior relief pitcher Kandice Irwin was named to the second team. First baseman Kasey Tydingco was honored on the all-freshman team.
- Head coach Frank Reed was named the Southern Conference Coach of the Year for the third-straight season and has been honored four times in nine seasons.
- After being selected all-conference, Tiffany Baker was also named to the All-South Region team by the National Fastpitch Coaches Association for the second-straight season at a different position as the East Ridge, Tenn., native transferred from second to third. Baker is the Chattanooga all-time home run leader with 32 as the East Ridge,

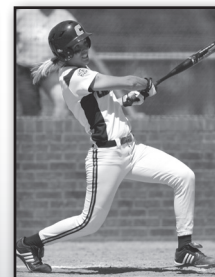

## 2009-10 SPORT-BY-SPORT RECAP

Tenn., native hit 14 homers last season tying the record with Angela Brewer (2001).  
 • Senior pitcher Brooke Loudermilk finished her collegiate career as one of the best pitchers in Chattanooga history. She concluded her four years as a Lady Moc fanning 872 batters setting the UTC and SoCon record and is among the leaders in every pitching category in the UTC record book.

**Soccer (J.D. Kyzer, head coach) • 7-8-1, 2-8-1 SoCon/11th**

- The Lady Mocs posted their best start in school history with five straight wins to start the season.
- Freshman Becca Smith led the league in seven categories including scoring, goals and goals per game. She was named Southern Conference All-Freshman.
- Becca Smith was ranked seventh among all NCAA Div. I freshmen in scoring and eighth in goals scored. She was nationally ranked by the NCAA among all Division I players 17th in points per game (1.75) and 21 in goals per game (.688).
- Sophomore Donna-Kay Henry was ranked second in the Southern Conference in scoring, goals and shots and was named All-Conference Second Team.
- Donna-Kay Henry was nationally ranked by the NCAA among all Division I players 40th in points per game (1.47) and 36th in goals per game (.6).

**Men's Tennis (Carlos Garcia, head coach) • 5-15, 2-8 SoCon/T10th**

- The Mocs posted a 5-15 overall record for the 2009-10 season, including 2-8 in Southern Conference action. UTC finished tied for 10th in the SoCon standings.
- UTC more than doubled their win total from last year's 2-18 record. They also ended a 17-match slide in SoCon action with a win over The Citadel during the regular season. Chattanooga also posted its first SoCon road win in two years with a victory at Samford.
- Roberto Vieira was named the Southern Conference Freshman of the Year. He led the team with a 14-7 overall record and was 5-4 in Southern Conference action.
- Along with his Freshman of the Year recognition, Vieira was also named to the All-SoCon First Team and was placed on the SoCon All-Freshman squad. It is the first time a Moc earned Freshman of the Year honors since Jason Ontog in 2001. It is the third consecutive year a UTC men's tennis player made the All-SoCon team for singles play.

**Women's Tennis (Jeff Clark, head coach) • 9-13, 3-7 SoCon/8th**

- Chattanooga finished the season with a 9-13 overall record. The Lady Mocs were eighth in the SoCon with a 3-7 league mark. It was the most conference wins in a season for UTC since going 6-4 in 2004.
- Jenna Nurik was named Freshman of the Year by the Southern Conference. Nurik played the No. 1 singles spot for the Lady Mocs throughout the season, posting a 21-9 overall record.
- In addition to being named Freshman of the Year, Nurik also earned first team All-SoCon honors and was a member of the SoCon All-Freshman squad. Nurik is the first Lady Moc to earn SoCon Freshman of the Year since Cynthia Oulevay took home the honors in 2001. Nurik is also the first UTC women's tennis player to earn first-team All-SoCon recognition since Anastasia Zhukova in 2007.
- The Lady Mocs were in some tight matches this spring, including five 4-3 losses. Chattanooga dropped matches to Austin Peay, Jacksonville State, UT-Martin, UAB and Georgia Southern by just one point.

**Indoor/Outdoor Track and Field (Bill Gautier, head coach)****Men (4th-In/6th-Out SoCon) • Women (6th-In, 5th-Out SoCon)**

- Senior Anneli Uys was named the Southern Conference Outdoor Track Female Athlete of the Year. She won the 800m and 1500m at the Southern Conference Outdoor Championships for the second straight year. She also qualified for the 1500m at the NCAA East Region Outdoor Championships where she finished 38th overall.
- Junior Tara Geitema earned All-SoCon honors in the 10K outdoors.
- Freshman Blake Olson made the SoCon All-Freshman team in the outdoors 400M hurdles.
- The women's indoor DMR team of Uys, freshmen Heather Stuive and Haley Horsh and senior Shelley Taylor earned All-SoCon honors.

**Volleyball (Lisa Rhodes, head coach) • 12-17, 4-8 SoCon/4th-North**

- Junior middle blocker Courtney Barnes led the offensive attack in 2009 for the Lady Mocs with 281 kills and .335 attacking percentage, which is second on the all-time chart. Barnes currently is third in career attack percentage at .298.
- Sophomore middle blocker Ellie Kuhn broke the season block assist record on the final home contest of the season with three block assists on back-to-back-to-back rallies to record her 101st of the season and pass Heather Gibson (1991). Kuhn had a total of 117 blocks on the season placing her eighth all-time.
- Freshman libero Paula Passmore was named to the SoCon All-Freshman Team after leading the conference with 5.41 digs per set, which was 13th nationally, and finished 10th on the season digs register with 546. Chattanooga as a team paced the SoCon digging up 1727 attacks, a 16.77 dig per set average.
- Senior Setter Bailee Chastain passed the 1,000 assist mark and enters her senior season with 1,226 assists, which is 10th all-time for a Lady Moc.

**Wrestling (Heath Eslinger, head coach)****11-7, 5-0 SoCon/1st • 55th NCAAs**

- Former Moc and Southern Conference Wrestler of the Year Heath Eslinger was hired on to replace Chris Bono on July 11, 2009.
- The Mocs finished the season with an 11-7 overall record, including a perfect 5-0 mark in the SoCon.
- Freshman Dean Pavlou captured the 149-pound title at the SoCon Tournament. He joined sophomore Jason McCroskey (184) as the Mocs sent two representatives to the NCAA Championships. McCroskey posted two wins at the NCAAs to lead UTC to a 55th place finish overall.
- UTC put four wrestlers on the NWCA annual Division I All-Academic Team, tying for the most in the nation.
- The Mocs rode a 30-match Southern Conference winning streak to capture their sixth regular season title in a row. UTC's last loss to a conference opponent was a 27-13 set-back at The Citadel on Feb. 14, 2004. The last time UTC dropped a home match in league action was a 26-12 loss to VMI on Feb. 22, 2003.
- The Mocs dominated the All-Southern Conference squad with five of the 10 honorees. Sophomore Demetrius Johnson was a repeat performer at 125. He was joined by senior Josh Statum (133), sophomore Brandon Wright (165) and freshmen Niko Brown (197) and Josh Condon (157). No other league squad had more than two representatives on the All-SoCon team.

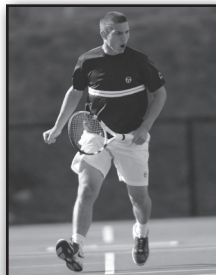

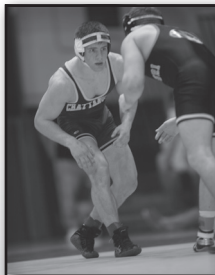

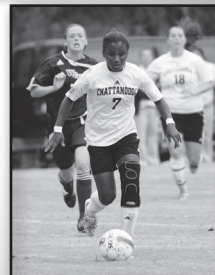

**MEDIA INFORMATION**

**CREDENTIALS**

Please contact Jay Blackman, UTC Assistant Athletics Director for Communications and Media Relations, for all Chattanooga home football game credentials. Requests should be made in writing via email and credentials will be limited to working members of the media. Spouses, dates, children and other nonworkers are not permitted in the press box without prior approval. Credentials will be available for pickup on gameday at the Will Call window at Finley Stadium. Will Call is located at the front of First Tennessee Pavilion to the west of the stadium.

**VISITING RADIO CREW INFORMATION**

Two courtesy broadcast-quality telephone lines are available for use by visiting crews, as is a private broadcast booth.

**PHOTOGRAPHERS**

Credentials for photographers will be issued on a game-by-game basis, and photographers should contact Jay Blackman, UTC Assistant Athletics Director for Communications and Media Relations, with requests. Photographers are expected to honor all sideline policies and are not permitted in either team bench area, locker area or other restricted areas within the stadium without prior approval from the UTC Communications and Media Relations Office.

**INTERNET SERVICE**

UTC will provide wireless Internet capability within the working area of the Finley Stadium press box.

**INTERNET SITES**

Only accredited Internet sites will be granted game credentials or access to UTC coaches and student-athletes. All inquiries must be made to Jay Blackman, UTC Assistant Athletics Director for Communications and Media Relations.

**MEDIA PARKING**

A limited number of media parking spaces are available and passes are required for access. The media parking area is located near the southwest corner of the stadium on the corner of 20th Street and Carter Street, adjacent to the First Tennessee Pavilion.

**GAMEDAY MEDIA SERVICES**

Members of the media will be provided with

pregame notes and statistics of both teams and a flipcard with respective rosters and updated team information. Food and beverages will also be available. Statistics and running play-by-play description will be handed out after each quarter. Following the game, a final statistical packet with complete team and individual statistics, play-by-play and quotes from both teams will be available.

**PRACTICES**

All UTC practices are open to the media and public unless otherwise noted. Media members are asked to contact the Communications and Media Relations Office in advance if planning to attend practice. The Mocs hold practice sessions at Scrappy Moore Field and Finley Stadium. Please check for practice times and sites.

**PLAYER INTERVIEWS**

**During Gameweek** — All requests for player interviews during gameweek should be made at least one day in advance with the Communications and Media Relations Office. A time mutually convenient for the athlete and the member of the media will be set up. Most interviews will be conducted following daily practice on location at the practice fields. Players will be asked to return telephone calls to members of the media; player telephone numbers will not be issued. During gameweek, the player interview deadline is Thursday evening. No player interviews will be conducted on Friday of gameweek. Please also arrange coaching staff interviews through the Communications and Media Relations Office. Head Coach Russ Huesman and his staff are available Monday through Thursday each week.

**After the Game** — Following a 10-minute cooling off period, Coach Russ Huesman will meet the members of the media in or near the Finley Stadium media room located between the two locker rooms behind the west end zone. Requested UTC players will also be available. The UTC locker room is closed to the media following the game. Visiting postgame interview policies are determined by the visiting school's representative.

**TO CONTACT COACH HUESMAN**

The best time to contact Coach Huesman by telephone is between 11:00 a.m. and noon Monday through Thursday. Call the Communications and Media Relations Office to set up an interview with Huesman, other football assistants or any UTC

staff member.

**TICKETS TO THE GAME**

Complimentary tickets are not available for media or professional scouts. Those wishing to purchase tickets are urged to contact the Communications and Media Relations Office, which will handle the order. Professional scouts must request credentials by email (jay-blackman@utc.edu). The cost is \$15 and the seat will be in the press box provided space is available. Credit cards are accepted.

**MOCS FOOTBALL MEDIA LUNCHEON**

All media representatives are invited to join Coach Huesman every Wednesday during the season for a weekly media luncheon. Lunch is served shortly after noon followed by comments from Huesman about the week's upcoming opponent. Several players will also be available for interviews. The luncheon will be in the media room adjacent to the Communications and Media Relations Office on the first floor of McKenzie Arena.

**SOUTHERN CONFERENCE TELECONFERENCE**

A coaches/media teleconference will be held weekly during the season. Each Southern Conference head coach will be available for eight-minute segments on a broadcast-quality, two-way feed. Check with the Southern Conference Office or the UTC Communications and Media Relations Office for the schedule and phone number of teleconference.

The radio broadcast team of Jim Reynolds and Todd Agne, together for their 14th season of Mocs' Football, will bring fans all 11 regular-season games.

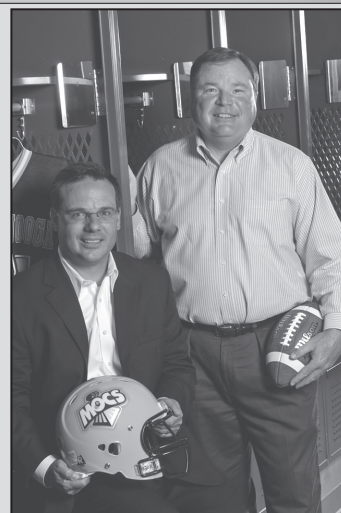

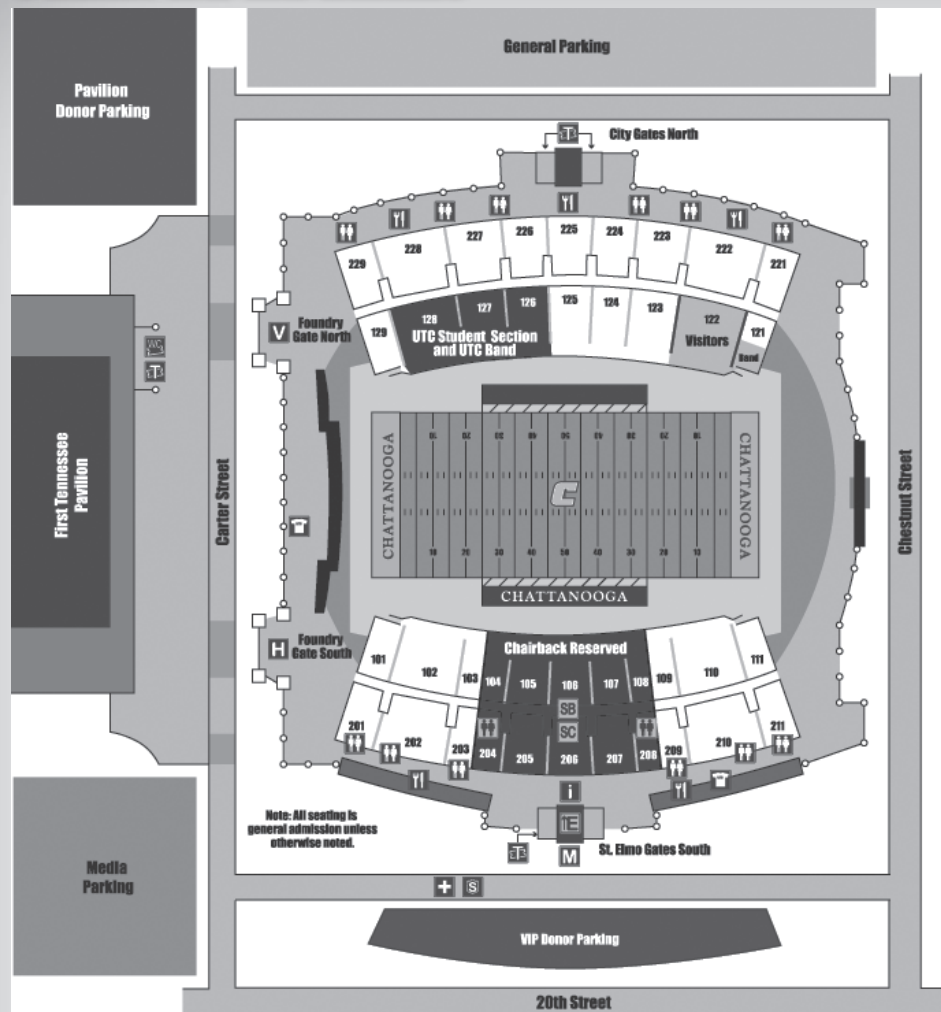
