

# *2009 SEASON REVIEW*

### QUICK NOTES TO KNOW

- First-year head coach Russ Huesman secured a winning record with a 6-5 mark and 4-4 in the Southern Conference. He has the most wins by a UTC first-year head coach since Bill Oliver went 8-3 in 1980. Coincidentally, Huesman was a junior DB on that 1980 squad. Harold Wilkes (9-1 in 1968) and Scrappy Moore (9-2 in 1931) each had nine wins in their first seasons at UTC.
- Chattanooga finished 6-5 on the year, securing the first winning season since 2005. UTC finished 4-4 in the SoCon for the first time since 1998. The Mocs' six wins equal the total of wins over the last three seasons 1-11 in 2008; 2-9 in 2007; 3-8 in 2006.
- Chattanooga went 4-1 at home, its best home record since moving to Finley Stadium in 1997.
- Senior DE Josh Beard led the nation and tied a single-season school record with 12.0 sacks on the year. He was the SoCon Defensive Player of the Year.
- DL Josh Williams set a new UTC freshman record with seven sacks on the season. The true freshman was fourth in the SoCon and T-31st in the FCS in sacks on the year. His seven sacks also tied for No. 3 on the Mocs' single-season list.
- Chattanooga totaled 30 sacks on the year, tying for second in the SoCon and 13th nationally.
- The Mocs' defense held five of its 11 opponents to 20 points or less. This is the first time since 2000 UTC has held five opponents to 20 points or less in a season.
- Senior linebacker Joseph Thornton started the final 38 consecutive games heading into the Alabama contest. He led the team and was No. 6 in the SoCon with 95 tackles on the year. His 269 career stops is ninth on the Mocs' all-time list.
- UTC finished second in the SoCon and 13th in the NCAA FCS in pass defense, allowing just 158.9 yards per game in the air. UTC also tied for second in the SoCon with 11 interceptions.
- Sophomore Jordan Tippit was second in the SoCon with five interceptions. He tied for 19th in the nation in that category. It was also the fifth most interceptions in a season in school history.
- The Mocs were a very disciplined team in 2009 and were penalized an average of 38.6 yards per game. That number was second in the SoCon and the 11th lowest total in the nation.
- The Mocs set or tied a number of school records, including the following

### **SEASON NO. 102**

The Chattanooga Mocs finished their 102nd season of collegiate football. The University of Chattanooga was founded in 1886 and football began play in 1904. No teams were fielded in 1917 and 1918 due to World War I. There was also a two-year hiatus from football action during World War II in 1943 and 1944. The Mocs have an all-time record of 455-469-32 (.493) and have

won 10 conference titles.

### **BEARD, CAMAY EARN ALL-AMERICAN HONORS**

Two members of the University of Tennessee at Chattanooga football team earned NCAA Football Championship Subdivision All-American honors from the Associated Press. Senior kicker Craig Camay was named to the second team while senior defensive lineman Josh Beard made the third team. Camay and Beard were the 24th and 25th Mocs to earn All-American honors.

### MOCS TIE SCHOOL RECORD WITH EIGHT ON THE ALL-SOCON TEAM

Between the SoCon media and coaches all-conference teams, eight Mocs were honored for their play in 2009, tying the school record since joining the SoCon in 1977 for all-conference recognition in a single season. UTC also had eight honorees on the 1979 squad. Senior DE Josh Beard and senior PK Craig Camay were first-team players on both the coaches and media squads. Senior WR Blue Cooper and junior OL Chris Harr were on the second team according to both the media and coaches. Sophomore DB Jordan Tippit was a first-team media selection while junior DB Buster Skrine was a first team selection by the coaches. Skrine was also a second team selection by the league's media, along with freshman DE Joshua Williams. Senior LB Joseph Thornton made the coaches second team.

### BEARD NAMED SOCON DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE YEAR & ALL-DECADE TEAM

Senior Josh Beard, a 6-1, 250-pound senior defensive end, came out of nowhere to grab Southern Conference Defensive Player of the Year honors according to the league's media and coaches in 2009. After making just eight tackles in eight games as a junior in 2008, Beard led the SoCon and tied for the national lead with 12 sacks in 2009. His 12 sacks equaled the ninth-highest single-season total in league history and the UTC school record. Beard was the first Moc to earn player of the year honors from the SoCon media. He was just the third Moc in school history to earn any SoCon Player of the Year honors. The Lincolnton, Ga., native recorded at least one sack in eight games in 2009, including a stretch in mid-October where he tallied two sacks in three consecutive games. In addition to his sacks, Beard tallied 62 tackles and four quarterback hurries. SouthernPigskin.com also placed Beard on its Southern Conference All-Decade squad. Beard was one of two Mocs on the All-Decade team, joining fellow defensive player Josh Cain (1999-02).

### CAMAY KICKS HIS WAY TO AN OUTSTANDING SEASON

Fifth-year senior Craig Camay had a very productive year as a place-kicker. He was a second team All-American and first team Southern Conference selection in 2009. He was 22-24 on PATs and 16-19 on field goals. He tied for the SoCon lead the SoCon in FGM (16) and was second in FG% (84.2%). He tied his own school record with four field goals against Western Carolina. His 52-yarder against Presbyterian tied for the second longest FG in school history. He made the last 12 consecutive FG attempts on the season, one shy of the UTC and school record for consecutive FGs made. Camay was also very effective with a trick on-side kick. He converted all five of his "surprise' on-side kicks. The only one the Mocs did not get was a traditional attempt against Furman.

### SOPHOMORE B.J. COLEMAN LIVED UP TO THE HYPE

Sophomore QB B.J. Coleman created quite a stir in the Scenic City when he announced his decision to transfer from Tennessee to Chattanooga. The former high school standout at McCallie in Chattanooga was fourth in the SoCon in total offense (210.8/game) and third in passing yards (213.5/game).

His numbers are even more impressive when you consider he had thrown a total of eight competitive passes the previous two seasons.

- 2,348 passing yards on the season
  - 31st in the nation
  - 7th Moc to throw for 2,000+ yards in a season
  - 1st to throw for 2,000 yards since 2004
  - No. 4 on the Mocs' single-season list
- Eight 200-yard passing games is No. 6 on the Mocs' career list
- 17 TDs tied with Steve Woods (1980) for No. 7 on the Mocs' single-season list.
- 39-61 for 356 yards and three TDs against The Citadel
  - 2 comps shy of the school record and the most by anyone in the SoCon in 2009
  - 5 attempts shy of the school record and the most by anyone in the SoCon in 2009
  - Most yards by a Moc since 2004

### AWUAH, WILLIAMS NAMED TO SOCON ALL-FRESHMAN TEAM

RB Chris Awuah and DE Joshua Williams both earned spots on the Southern Conference All-Freshman team. Awauh led the Mocs in rushing with 453 yards on the year. He took over the starting role as a true freshman after senior Bryan Fitzgerald was lost for the year in the Samford game. He finished with four rushing TDs and averaged 3.0 yards per carry. Williams, another true freshman, set a UTC freshman record with seven sacks on the year. He was also third in the SoCon in that category.

### COOPER FINISHED IN THE TOP-10 FOR CATCHES PER GAME

Senior WR Blue Cooper finished second in the SoCon and sixth in the nation with 7.6 receptions-per-game and is third in the league and 38th in the nation with 74.9 receiving yards-per-game.

- His 84 catches on the year were third-most in a season at UTC
- 152 career receptions is No. 4 all-time at UTC
  - Passed Terrell Owens (1992-95) for career receptions in The Citadel game
- 1,790 career receiving yards is No. 8 all-time at UTC
- Biggest catch of the year came after The Citadel game when he proposed to his girlfriend, Maci Gault, on the field at Finley Stadium. She, of course, said "Yes." Maci is the sister of UTC former UTC QB/WR Jare Gault.

### O-LINE DOES NOT ALLOW A SACK IN THE LAST FOUR GAMES OF 2009

• The Mocs' offensive line allowed only nine sacks on the season, the second fewest in the SoCon and tied for 4th fewest in the nation. UTC has not allowed a sack in the last four games, a string of 176 pass plays. That included a matchup against FBS Champion Alabama in the season finale. Starting QB B.J. Coleman has not been sacked since the Georgia Southern game on Oct. 17. He went the final 213 pass plays of the year without being sacked.

### **HUESMAN NAMED SOCON COACH OF THE YEAR**

Head coach Russ Huesman was named the 2009 Southern Conference Coach of the Year by the league's media and shared the honor with Appalachian State's Jerry Moore according to the league's coaches. Huesman was the architect of one of the greatest turnarounds in SoCon history, guiding his alma mater to a 6-5 overall mark and 4-4 record in league play in just his first year. After a 1-11, 0-8 campaign in 2008, the five-win turnaround ties for the best in school history. The results were just as noticeable in the stands where UTC averaged over 10,000 fans per game for the first time in Finley Stadium history and nearly doubled the attendance average from a year ago. Huesman's six victories are the most by a first-year Chattanooga coach since Bill Oliver went 8-3 in 1980. Huesman is the first Moc to earn coach of the year honors from the league's coaches since Buddy Nix in 1990.

### SCHOOL-RECORD EIGHT MOCS EARN SOCON PLAYER OF THE WEEK HONORS

UTC had three different student-athletes earn Southern Conference Player of the Week honors for the first time in school history following Week 3. Senior Bryan Fitzgerald won the offensive award, sophomore Ryan Consiglio earned the defensive honor while sophomore Mike Hammons took home special teams recognition. The last time the Mocs won three Player of the

Week honors was Sept. 23, 1989, when James Roberts was the Offensive and Freshman of the Week and Junior Jackson won the defensive honor. After not winning a single weekly honor in 2008, Chattanooga has won a school-record eight awards handed out by the SoCon this season. The other winners were Craig Camay (ST-W2; ST-W11), Chris Awuah (Fr-W2), Josh Beard (Def-W6) and Johsua Williams (Fr-W11).

### **LOSING STREAKS END IN 2009**

The Mocs snapped a 10-game losing streak with their win over Glenville State on Sept. 3. They also ended a 17-game losing streak against Division I opponents with their 29-13 win against Presbyterian. Chattanooga had lost nine straight road games overall before defeating Presbyterian. UTC also won its first non-conference game against a Division I opponent since a 31-7 victory at Tennessee Tech, on Aug. 31, 2006, with the PC win. The Wofford win snapped a 13-game SoCon losing streak. The Samford win stopped a six-game SoCon road losing streak. Chattanooga also stopped a three-game slide against The Citadel.

### SCHOOL-RECORD 10 MOCS EARN ACADEMIC ALL-SOCON HONORS

The Mocs put 10 student-athletes on the 2009 fall Academic All-SoCon team, shattering the previous high of four in the 2007 season. Included on the team were senior Steven Smigelsky, sophomores Joel Bradford, Nick Craig, Ryan Geist, Mike Hammons and Brock Oliver and redshirt freshmen Adam Miller, Dustin Tate, Jeff Veres and Austin Wilson. To be eligible, a student-athlete must possess at least a 3.2 cumulative grade point average entering the fall season and must have competed in at least one-half of their team's competitions during the recently-concluded fall campaign. In addition, the student-athletes must have successfully completed at least 24 credit hours in the previous two semesters.

### MORE MOCS HONORED FOR THEIR WORK IN THE CLASSROOM

A total of 36 members of the UTC football program were honored for their work in the classroom for the 2009 fall semester. Chris Awuah, Joel Bradford, Will Brooks, Justin Buckhalter, David Clemons, B.J. Coleman, Ryan Consiglio, Blue Cooper, Don Cope, J.D. Dothard, Courtland Ellzey, Ryan Geist, Mike Hammons, Derek Harper, Chris Harr, Shane Heatherly, Irvin Hernandez, T.J. Hurless, D.J. Key, Chris Marshall, Ryan McGowan, Adam Miller, Gunner Miller, Steven Nease, Graham Nichols, Brock Oliver, Cody Romans, Connor Rosenbaum, Steven Smigelsky, Dustin Tate, Joseph Thornton, Jordan Tippit, Jeff Veres, Joshua Williams, Austin Wilson and Clint Woods were all named to the Athletics Director's Honor Roll for having a 3.0+ grade-point-average for the fall semester. A group of 21, including Bradford, Brooks, Buckhalter, Clemons, Coleman, Cooper, Cope, Dothard, Geist, Hammons, Heatherly, Hernandez, Hurless, Key, McGowan, Miller, Nease, Oliver, Rosenbaum, Williams and Woods all made the Dean's List for having a 3.2+ g.p.a.

### MOCS POST IMPRESSIVE ATTENDANCE JUMP

Mocs fans spun the turnstiles at Finley Stadium at a near-record pace in 2009. UTC had the third largest crowd at Finley Stadium against Glenville State (14,002) and the fifth highest attendance against Furman (11,201). UTC finished the year No. 34 in total attendance (52,515) and No. 31 in average attendance (10,503) in the FCS. Chattanooga averaged 10,000+ for a full season for the first time since moving to Finley Stadium in 1997.

### MOCS SET RECORD FOR SEASON TICKET SALES

The Chattanooga Mocs broke the all-time season ticket mark at Finley Stadium with 2,527 sold in 2009. The previous school record of 2,300 season tickets sold was set in the 1997 season, the first year of Finley Stadium. This is the third year UTC has topped the 2000-sold mark, including 2,003 sold in 1998. Chattanooga nearly doubled its sales from 2008 when 1,271 were sold.

### Game 1

### CHATTANOOGA 30, No. 22 Glenville State 13 Sept. 3 • Finley Stadium

CHATTANOOGA, Tenn. - Chattanooga opened its season with a 30-13 victory Thursday over Glenville State (1-1) in front of 14,002 fans, the third-largest crowd at Finley Stadium. Head coach Russ Huesman recorded a win in his head coaching debut.

Sophomore quarterback B.J. Coleman completed 18 of his 34 passes for a game-high 258 yards, while senior wide receiver Blue Cooper paced the Mocs' receiving corps catching eight balls for 127 yards. The Chattanooga ground attack was led by freshman tailback Chris Awuah who picked up 63 yards on 13 carries.

Coleman, who transferred from Tennessee during the summer, completed his first four passes for 71 yards and finished the first half with 205 yards going 13-21 with one touchdown and zero interceptions

Early in the second quarter, freshman tailback Chris Awuah ran left on a broken play for three yards scoring the second touchdown of the game and the first of his career, also on his first collegiate carry. On the drive, senior quarterback Jare Gault entered the backfield with Coleman split wide and ran 15 yards converting a key third-and-two carrying the ball inside the five.

After a nine-play drive stalled on its next possession, Glenville State pinned the Mocs deep at their own 13 on a 26-yard punt by Tanner Collins, but Coleman and his Mocs responded quickly. He found tight end Garrett Hughes down the right sideline for a 73-yard touchdown and a 21-0 halftime cushion.

The Mocs continued to impress on offense in the second half with Coleman completing a 19-yard pass to Cooper. Awuah broke free for a 22-yard rush before finishing off the 10-play, 80-yard drive with a two-yard carry up the middle giving Chattanooga a 28-0 lead.

Just before the end of the third quarter, Glenville State got on the scoreboard with a 28-yard scamper by DeAndre Brown. On the point after, sophomore Nick Craig caught the failed extra point returning the ball to the 35 before pitching to Skrine who weaved his way running down the right sideline, cutting back to the left, catching a fumbled ball off a single bounce and scrambling even further through the Pioneers before diving into the end zone for the two-point conversion extending the Mocs' advantage to 30-6.

The Pioneers scored their second touchdown of the game with 1:37 left in the game when Joe Mesidue broke through the Chattanooga defense from 26 yards out

The defense was led by senior linebacker Joe Thornton's career-high 17 tackles, eight of which were solos, one-and-a-half for loss (seven yards) and two pass breakups. A trio of defenders - Doug Faatiglia, Steven Smigelsky and Jaron Norfleet - each posted nine tackles with all three registering career highs with the effort with Smigelsky's total coming in the first collegiate start for the senior.

# Game 2 Furman 38, CHATTANOOGA 20 Sept. 12 • Finley Stadium

CHATTANOOGA, Tenn. - UTC dropped a 38-20 decision to Furman in front of 11,201 at Finley Stadium. The Mocs couldn't overcome a couple of key turnovers along with a bad snap in the kicking game.

Senior wideout Blue Cooper was the standout for the Mocs with a career-high 13 catches for 109 yards. He opens the season with back-to-back 100-yard reception games.

The Paladins had their way of things offensively in the first half, but the Mocs defense righted the ship in the second. Chattanooga allowed just 112 total vards in the second half after Furman ran and passed its way down the field in the first. In fact, Paladins quarterback Jordan Sorrells threw for 120 yards on eight of 10 passing in the first half, but completed just three of nine after the break for 19 yards.

The Mocs opened the game on a high note recovering an on-side kick, getting the ball at its own 39. On the first play, sophomore B.J. Coleman was hit as he threw and his pass was intercepted by Max Lerner who returned it 43 yards for the score.

On the second drive of the game, the Mocs methodically moved the ball down the field before a fumble on a Bryan Fitzgerald run gave the Paladins the ball on their own 30. Furman then marched 70 yards in eight plays scoring on a Chris Truss catch from Sorrells from two yards out to make it 14-0.

The Mocs struck gold on their third drive with a 52-yard catch-and-run by Chris Awuah. Coleman hit him on the left side on third down and he scampered down the sideline to make it 14-7 to complete the 81-yard, sixplay drive (3:07).

Furman answered quickly starting the drive on its own 42. Four plays in, Uhaa ran off tackle left for 34 yards to make it 21-7.

Chattanooga continued to move the ball as well with a six-minute, 18second drive ending with a 35-yard field by senior Craig Camay. The Mocs went 56 yards in 16 plays before the drive stalled. Fitzgerald and Awuah combined for 40 all-purpose yards on the drive.

The final drive of the half belonged to Furman and after moving the ball to the Mocs' one-foot line, the Paladins' Uhaa was stuffed twice at the line of scrimmage, but with four seconds remaining, Uhaa got one more chance and scored as time expired to put Furman up 28-10 at the half.

Even in the loss, there were a lot of positives for the Mocs on both sides of the ball. The defensive effort in the second half, along with the offense consistently moving the ball were definite bright spots. The Mocs had five drives of six or more plays in 10 total possessions. There was only one three-and-out and a score on a two-play drive.

### Game 3 Chattanooga 29, PRESBYTERIAN 13 Sept. 19 • Bailey Memorial Stadium

CLINTON, S.C. - The Chattanooga Mocs improved to 2-1 for the first time since the 2005 season with a 29-13 win at Presbyterian College (0-3) in Clinton, S.C., today. The Mocs (2-1, 0-1 SoCon) were led by senior RB Bryan Fitzgerald's 181 yards rushing and a strong second half surge by the defense to post their first road win in almost two seasons.

After the Mocs' opening drive stalled. PC took over deep in its own territory. Freshman linebacker Ryan Consiglio snagged his first career interception on the Blue Hose' first offensive play, giving UTC excellent field position on the PC 16-yard-line. The Mocs gave six of those yards back and the drive ended with senior Craig Camay missing a 39-yard FG attempt. The Blue Hose responded with a 69-yard drive that ended in a 26-yard FG by Aaron Mayes, giving PC a 3-0 lead.

The Blue Hose went up 10-3 with 12:54 left in the first half on a one-vard run by Trandon Dendy. The Mocs' ensuing drive seemed to stall after two plays, but Coleman hit junior TE Garrett Huges over the middle for a 41-yard reception to get to PC's 24 yard line. Three plays later, Coleman found junior Chris Pitchford on the far side to tie the game again at 10-10.

UTC's defense settled down in the second half and only allowed 107 yards of total offense after the break. Chattanooga scored again on a 22yard TD pass from Coleman to Davis with just over 10 minutes left in the third quarter. The PAT was blocked and the score remained 22-10. The final score of the game came at the end of the third on a three-vard TD run by Fitzgerald.

Fitzgerald's 181 yards on the ground set a new career-high and was the first 100-yard rushing game by a Moc since he and Erroll Wynn topped the century mark in the last game of the 2007 season.

Sophomore QB B.J.Coleman finished the game 16-29 passing for 224 yards and a pair of TDs. It is his third consecutive 200-yard passing game. Davis finished with three catches for 76 yards and a touchdown while seniors Blue Cooper (45 yards, Clint Woods (39 yards) and Pitchford (23 yards, 1 TD) all had four catches each.

Consiglio led Chattanooga's defense with a season-high 12 tackles and a sack to go with his early interception. UTC posted five sacks on the night and senior Joeseph Thorton added his fifth career interception.

Wofford was led by Mike Rucker's 57 rushing yards on nine carries. Wideout Justice Joslin had three catches for 60 yards and the Terriers' lone touchdown. Defensively, Tommy Irvin and Keaton Thompson each had a game-high 11 tackles.

It was a well-rounded defensive effort for the Mocs led by redshirt freshman Ryan Consiglio's nine stops. Senior Joe Thornton had a thunderous stop to go with his five tackles, while senior defensive end Josh Beard had the lone sack along with his four tackles. The front seven had 39 of the Mocs

CHATTANOOGA, Tenn. - It was a scary start to a rainy Halloween day game, but the University of Tennessee at Chattanooga (5-3/3-3) football team concluded Blue & Gold Week with a 24-20 win over Western Carolina (1-7/1-5) in front of 9,320 fans at Finley Stadium. The Mocs overcame a 20-9 second-half deficit to claim the fifth win of the season. UTC is now one win shy this season of equaling its win total from the previous three years combined.

The winning drive came late in the fourth quarter on a Chris Awuah sixyard scamper untouched to make it 24-20. Mocs QB B.J. Coleman orchestrated a 16-play, 77-yard, seven-minute, 24-second drive to put Chattanooga up for good with 3:33 to play.

After a quick first down, the Mocs defense held the Catamounts on the next four plays to turn the ball over with big plays on a sack by freshman DE Josh Williams and a pass breakup by junior CB Buster Skrine. The offense held the ball until the 16-second mark giving the Catamounts the ball back with too little time to mount a drive.

Coleman was 22-for-41 passing for 248 yards and an interception. He completed passes to seven different Mocs which was quite an accomplishment since 16 of those catches were recorded by senior wideout Blue Cooper. Six other receivers caught one pass apiece.

Cooper tallied 143 yards on 16 receptions setting a career-high for catches in a game, while notching a season high for yards with his third 100-yard receiving game. The 16 catches were two shy of the Mocs game and Southern Conference record set by Alonzo Nix with 18 against Wofford

On a day where the Mocs did not attempt a point-after kick, rather twice going for two-point conversions, the kicking game was a highlight. Senior PK Craig Camay tied a career-high with four field goals hitting from 27, 28, 30 and 37 yards. The kickoff return team was also key to victory with the Catamounts average starting position being their own 25 while averaging iust 14.2 vards per return.

# No. 7 APPALACHIAN STATE 35, Chattanooga 20 Nov. 7 • Kidd Brewer Satdium

BOONE, N.C. - The University of Tennessee at Chattanooga football team dropped a hard-fought 35-20 contest at No. 8 Appalachian State. The Mocs scored 20 unanswered points to cut the ASU lead to 21-20 with just under 11 minutes left in the fourth quarter, but could not complete a secondstraight come-from-behind win.

Chattanooga (5-4, 3-4 SoCon) spotted the Mountaineers (7-2, 6-0 So-Con) 21 points in the opening frame with the first score coming after an Appalachian State interception. Sophomore QB B.J. Coleman hit junior TE Garrett Hughes on the third play of the game. However, Hughes was unable to pull the pass in. ASU's D.J. Smith snatched the ball out of the air and returned it 34 yards to the Mocs' 1-yard line.

Two plays later, Devin Moore punched in a 1-yard strike to put ASU up 7-0 with over 12 minutes left in the first quarter.

The same play was repeated two plays into the Mocs' second drive when Coleman hit senior WR Clint Woods over the middle. Woods also had trouble tucking away the pass and ASU's Jacque Roman took that ball out of the air on the Mocs' 39

Chattanooga's defense pushed ASU back three-yards and forced a punt after a three-and-out to keep the game 7-0. The Mountaineers were able to score on back-to-back drives to push the lead to 21-0 at the end of the first quarter, equaling the most points UTC has allowed in the open period this season.

Chattanooga came out of the locker room with an aggressive approach, converting two-straight on-side kicks to start the second half. UTC was only able to muster three points on the two extra possessions, but the back-toback conversions energized the team and helped the Mocs gain the momen-

Chattanooga actually outgained ASU 351-322, including 246-140 in the air. Coleman finished 25-46 for 246 yards, one TD and three interceptions. Those were season-highs in attempts, completions and interceptions.

ASU senior QB Armanti Edwards came into the game No. 2 in the nation in total offense, averaging 361.9 yards per game. Chattanooga held Edwards to 192 yards of offense in the game.

Freshman RB Chris Awuah also had a solid game, posting a seasonhigh 97 yards on 28 carries. Pitchford had his second 100-yard receiving game of the season with 106 on a career-high nine catches.

CHATTANOOGA, Tenn. - Fifteen Chattanooga (6-4/4-4) football players played their final home game at Finley Stadium. It was a memorable afternoon as the Mocs captured a stirring 31-28 win over The Citadel (4-6/2-5). Chattanooga mounted its largest fourth quarter comeback in school history after trailing by 15 points, 28-13, with 13 minutes remaining in the game.

B.J. Coleman's 356 passing yards keyed the Mocs charge. He completed 39 of 61 attempts including three scores and one interception. The completions, yards and attempts are all season highs for the Chattanooga

Cooper caught 14 passes for 139 yards and two scores, both pivotal in the fourth quarter comeback. The fifth-year senior's game was dull in comparison to his post-game celebration as he proposed to Maci Gault, teammate Jare's sister.

Gault, last year's starting QB, caught seven passes for 70, but he made two of the biggest catches of the day to continue drives. Tight end Garrett Hughes added eight receptions for 72 yards, while Pitchford had six catches for 50 yards and a score.

Edwards led the Bulldogs with 214 yards in the air on 21 of 37 passing and three scores. The Mocs could not force a turnover on him, but they did record four sacks. Roberts caught 10 balls for 107 yards and two touch-

The Citadel converted eight of 10 third downs through the first three quarters, but managed just one-for-five in the fourth. The Bulldogs defense held the Mocs to just 17 rushing vards which is the fewest in Chattanooga in a win.

The Chattanooga defense was led by senior middle linebacker Steven Smigelsky who recorded 11 tackles with two for loss including a sack. The Southern Conference's sack leader, and No. 2 in the nation, Josh Beard made his final home game memorable recording one-and-a-half sacks to give him 12 on the season which ties the school record held by Tyler Un-

True freshman DE Josh Williams came up big as well with seven stops The Mocs broke up 11 passes led by senior LB Doug Faatiliga's four. Faatiliga made the tackle of the game on the Bulldogs' fourth-and-one with 4:29

The six wins match the total of the last three seasons combined for the Mocs. It also clinches Chattanooga's first winning season since 2005.

Going up against a top-ranked defense proved to be difficult for the Chattanooga offense as they gained just 84 yards on 48 plays. Coleman had players in his face the entire game completing just seven of his 21 attempts for 36 yards and two interceptions.

The Mocs also had difficulty running the football as senior Shaun Kermah, freshman J.J. Jackson and freshman Bo Dyer had six attempts each gaining a total of 39 yards.

With the offense having trouble moving the ball, the defense was on the field for most of the game. Senior Steven Smigelsky tied a career-high for the second straight game with 11 tackles. Fellow senior Joseph Thornton and sophomore Jordan Tippit each added nine more tackles. The Mocs got to the Alabama quarterback twice in the game for a loss of 17 yards.
